### Public Examinations - Year 11 and Post 16 Students

It is of vital importance that each student presents at college fully prepared for each examination he/she is entered for at least 30 minutes before it is scheduled to commence. Students are required to attend all examinations in full college uniform and with the required equipment. For Science and Mathematics examinations, they must have a calculator, ruler, pencil and a geometry set. Students must also bring a black biro to each examination. The use of mobile telephones and other electronic devices are NOT PERMITTED in the examination hall. Therefore, it is requested that students do not bring these items to college when they have an examination. If students do need to have any such devices with them, they must hand them to the invigilation staff at the start of each examination. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from the examination. Students must attend the examination(s) for which they have been entered for. In the event of illness or an emergency situation that prevents your child attending or means your child will be late, please make contact with the College as soon as possible so that appropriate advice can be given and arrangements put in place. Please note that your child's final examination grade will be adversely affected if he/she fails to attend a scheduled examination.
