Curriculum and Assessment



Rosedale offers an outstanding curriculum which is carefully tailored and personalised to meet individual needs and is leading the way in terms of the progress each student makes during their time at the College. We use a wide range of teaching approaches to encourage the engagement, enjoyment and interest which are essential to good learning. To ensure all students are treated justly and have equal opportunities to learn, our Teaching and Learning Associates provide expert help for students who may be experiencing difficulties. Special provision is made on an individual basis according to the particular circumstances of the student.

During Key Stage 3, all students follow the National Curriculum, which includes English, Mathematics, Science, Information and Communication Technology, Religious Education, History, Geography, French, Art and Design, Drama, Music, Design Technology, Physical Education (PE) and Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE).

At Key Stage 4, students study English, English Literature, Mathematics, Science as well as take part in Physical Education.

There are a variety of GCSE options available and all students continue to follow a course in Religious Education, Citizenship and History. In addition, students are offered a range of vocational options, designed to be as open and flexible as possible to enable students to make choices to suit their aptitudes and interests, providing a solid base for further education prospects.

The College is committed to providing a comprehensive range of courses for Post 16 learners and has a vibrant and popular Post 16 Centre. The offer provides students with a wide range of academic and vocational courses, designed to meet the needs of all learners. Good quality teaching, along with high expectations and strong leadership, means students thrive in Post 16. The College has a proven track record of adding value to all of the students' overall achievement, with many going on to undergraduate courses at university.

Students are given support and guidance on all aspects of their educational career, ranging from course choices and apprenticeship and training research to helping with university preparation.

Students are assessed by their subject teachers every half term and progress is measured against end of Key Stage targets. Parents, guardians and carers are kept informed of their child's progress throughout the academic year at 'Academic Review' meetings and through reports sent home. Students in examination years also benefit from practising trial examinations and past papers. The College has a wide ranging out of hours provision of additional support classes and intervention sessions.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

We believe very strongly in the importance of sport and exercise, as the benefits of leading an active and healthy lifestyle are endless. Regular participation in exercise or sport not only improves health levels, confidence levels and social relationships but studies show that it also leads to higher levels of academic attainment. For these reasons, the Physical Education curriculum is very broad and offers students as many different activities as possible during the two hours of physical education timetabled for students each week. During this time students are introduced to new sports, cover all aspects of the national Physical Education syllabus, acquire new techniques and refine skills already owned.

In addition to this, we present students with rich extra-curricular programmes after college, which allows them to extend their interest and participation in sport and various clubs. Clubs range from social activities where students meet new friends within a healthy environment to more serious societies for those wishing to form a team and compete against other schools and colleges within the borough. Regardless of where our students fall within this continuum there is something for everyone and we encourage as many students as possible to take advantage of this and take steps to adopt and maintain an active and healthy lifestyle.

COLLEGE FACILITIES

The College benefits from a high tech, floodlit synthetic pitch, outdoor multi use sports courts and a large indoor sports hall. Our STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) building houses specialist learning areas equipped with best possible resources and equipment to support our students, while our younger Key Stage 3 students benefit from having their own space on the College campus in order to aid their transition from primary school.
