Re: GCSE and A-Level Results Collection 2022

I am writing to inform you about the arrangements for the GCE (Thursday 18th August) and GCSE (Thursday 25th August) results day. The college will be open to students from 9:00am until 12:00pm to collect their examination results.

BTEC courses do not issue results in the same way that GCSE and GCE do. You may receive a 'Notification of Performance' but these do not come in time for the GCSE and GCE Results day. However, your BTEC teacher will be able to confirm your overall grade.

If your child is unable to collect their results in person, a family member can pick them up on their behalf, but they MUST have signed written permission from the student and the named person collecting must produce ID in order to receive the results. If you have any queries before the results day, please do not hesitate to contact your college reception. We very much look forward to celebrating the culmination of hard work with your child and wish them every success for the future as they embark on their sixth form studies.

GDPR (General Data Protection Regulations) 2022

From May 25th 2018 we will not be able to provide copies of college reports and/or results for students once they have left. This includes providing data for references and interviews such as grades, targets, results and attendance. **Please can we ask all students, especially those in Year 11, and Post 16 students to keep their college reports and examination results slips safe**. Students can still request anecdotal references (those that do not require data such as grades or attendance) by contacting the Data Protection Officer, Ravinder Chana, via Rowensbrook Training. Employers, universities and colleges will be well aware of these new regulations and will expect students to have retained their personal copies of their reports and results.
