

## Cricket Victory

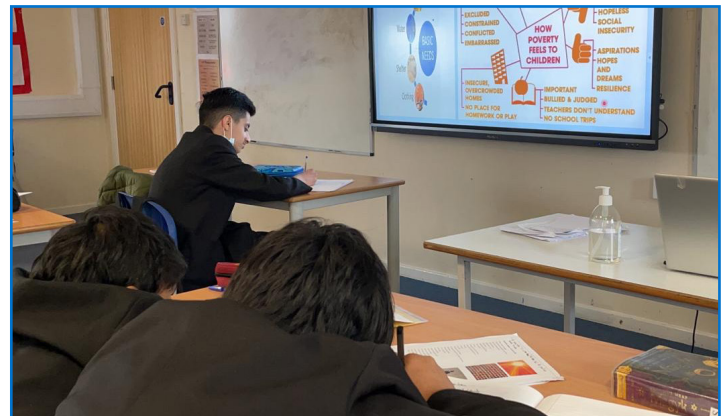
