What are the aims and intentions of this curriculum?

The aim of our Key Stage 3 Curriculum is to provide students with knowledge of a rich variety music from different times and places. Students will gain knowledge that will feed into GCSE and also the ability to continue self-directed studies with music.

Autumn 1	SINGING Encouraging students to form good working relationships and to develop mature conflict and resolution skills. Careers and life skills: Confidence, Voice Projection, Creative thinking, Speaking and Presentation skills.	Students will learn to sing a song as a group. They will learn some basic notation and musical dynamics. <u>Key terms</u> Melody, Harmony, solo, dynamics, crescendo, diminuendo, choir (SATB), dotted rhythm, triplet, peer learning.	 Ensemble skills- learning to work in groups of varying sizes (pair, group and whole class). Basic Musicianship skills - Learning to sing 3 songs (a popular song, musical song and folk song). Some students will perform in the Open Evening. Performance skills - Performing with an awareness of different parts (duet, unison, 3- part harmony). 	Ensemble performance of piece of relevant music.
Autumn 2	ELEMENTS OF MUSIC Careers and life skills: Confidence, Developing Fine Motor Skills, Creative thinking, Collaboration, Problem Solving, Speaking and Presentation skills, Instrumentalist, Composer, Musical Director/Conductor, Sound Production, Editor, Arts Journalism, Working in Theatre.	Students will learn about the building blocks that music is made out of and how they are used together. <u>Key Terms</u> Tempo, Pitch, dynamics, duration, structure, texture, timbre, silence,	 General musicianship skills - Learning about and using the different elements of music (tempo, dynamics, pitch etc). Instrumental and Rhythm skills - Use of percussion instruments to create a piece of music. Use of musical notes and rests. 	Listening and identification of the elements of music and ensemble performance.

Spring 1	INSTRUMENTS OF THE ORCHESTRA Gender and racial diversity in historical figures Careers and life skills: Confidence, Developing Fine Motor Skills, Creative thinking, Collaboration, Problem Solving, Speaking and Presentation skills	Students will learn about the instrument groups that make up an orchestra and some basic terms for orchestral music. <u>Key Terms</u> Strings, woodwind, brass, percussion, pitch Timbre, performance, Rehearsal, theme, variations, rhythm.	 Listening and appraisal skills -Study of Western Classical music traditions Music theory skills - Learning about structure and form (Binary, Ternary and Rondo Form). Notations skills - Learning how to read music using staff notation. Performance and composition skills - Performing Frere Jacques and creating a theme and variation piece. 	Ensemble performance of 'Variations on frère Jacques'.
Spring 2	CHINESE MUSIC Encouraging students to form good working relationships and to develop mature conflict and resolution skills. Instrumentalist, Composer, Musical Director/Conductor, Sound Production, Editor, Arts Journalism, Working in Theatre.	Students will learn about some of the traditional folk music from china and the theory behind it. <u>Key Terms</u> Pentatonic Scale, black notes, major scale, minor, scale, improvisation, drone, sharps, flats, enharmonic.	 Continuing to read music using staff notation. Performance skills - Performing a Chinese song using the keyboard and percussion instruments. 	Ensemble performance of the 'China Town' and group composition using the pentatonic scale.

Summer 1	ROCK SCHOOL Gender and racial diversity in historical figures Ensuring there is gender and cultural diversity here. Careers and life skills: Confidence, Developing Fine Motor Skills, Creative thinking, Collaboration, Problem Solving, Speaking and Presentation skills	Students will learn how to work together in a band setting to perform a piece of rock music. <u>Key terms</u> Chord sequence, Guitar, Bass guitar, Drum kit,	 Performance skills - Learning to perform a modern song- 'Shake It Off' as small class bands. Instrumental skills - Students learn to play chords using the keyboard, guitar, ukulele and bass guitar. Some learn the drum kit. 	Ensemble performance as part of a rock band.
