

## What are the aims and intentions of this curriculum?

The aim of this curriculum is to further embed concepts learned in Year 7 and 8 and to create a foundation for GCSE Citizenship. Students will develop an understanding of the importance of Identity and Immigration, law, the economy and how immigrants and citizens alike have played a role in developing the UK. They will also be exposed to Good Consumer Practices, their Rights and Responsibilities as well as how the Electoral Systems and political parties contribute to Governance in the UK.

Finally, students will explore ways in which they can make a difference in their school and the wider society by examining ways to research and leading campaigns.

Autumn 2	Consumer Affairs and Budgeting	<ul> <li>The students will understand why budgeting is important to families and to the government. They will also examine the importance of austerity measures, the rights and responsibilities of consumers.</li> <li>Making good Consumer decisions and learning how to budget and make good consumer choices.</li> <li>Learners will be able to understand the role of the Chancellor of the Exchequer and other key political post then make a link with how these affect our lives daily.</li> <li>Learners will create their own personal budgets based on the money they receive on a monthly basis, with the aim of increasing their savings. They will also examine areas of government spending and discuss that areas need to be increased and decreased.
