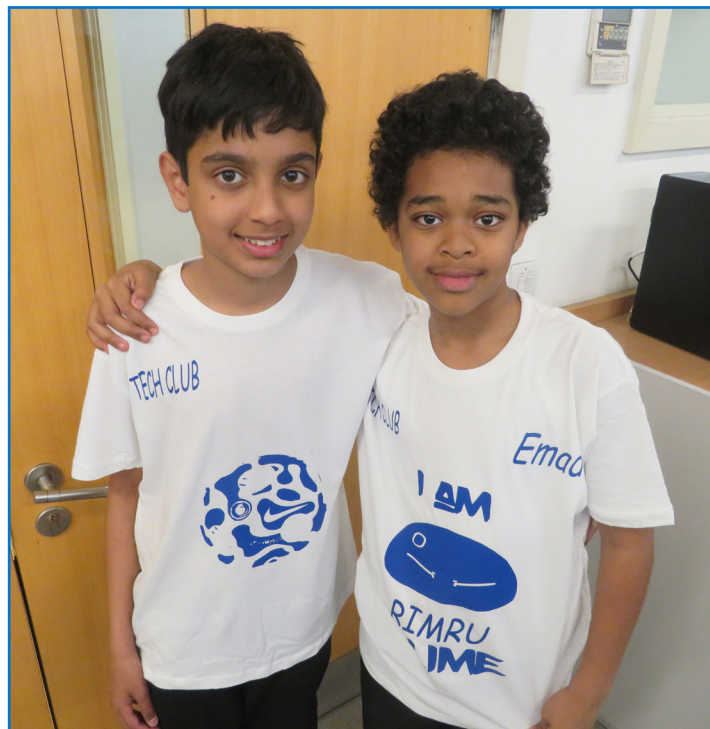
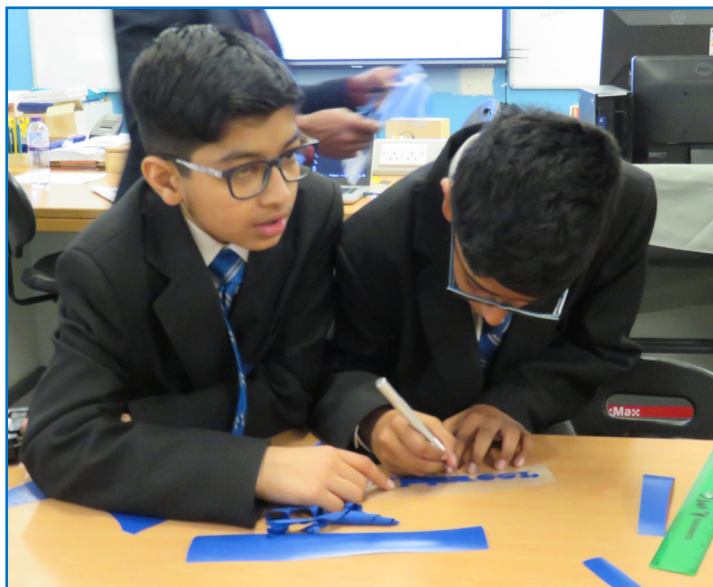


Technology Club

IQM Inclusive School Award

On Tuesday 29th March, Rosedale College was visited by an IQM assessor to review our Inclusion Quality Mark. Ofsted defines an educationally inclusive school as one in which the teaching and learning, achievements, attitudes and well-being of every young person matter.

An Inclusion Quality Mark provides schools with a nationally recognised framework and helps schools evaluate and measure how they are performing. The Inclusion Quality Principles include promoting access and diversity, raising achievement for all and creating an environment for all to succeed. There are three award levels beginning with the IQM Inclusive School Award which is followed by two higher award levels - the IQM Centre of Excellence Award and the highest accolade of IQM Flagship School Award.

We are proud to announce that we have achieved the IQM Flagship Status following our recent assessment. Rosedale College passed the review with flying colours with the assessor commenting 'I am blown away by what you do here' and as a result, we have maintained the top award of IQM Flagship School. The assessor met with the Assistant Principal and the Vice Principal in the morning before enjoying a tour of our college. She then had a number of meetings throughout the day with staff, students, parents, guardians and carers. All throughout the day, she spent time speaking to various parties and looking at evidence to support, in her words, 'the fantastic work we do.' A report was soon published following the review. During the time of these examinations, all Year 10 students must attend college at the normal time of 8:45am each day. Students need to go directly to their Form Room for morning registration and will then either attend normal lessons or a timetabled examination, whichever is applicable.

It is important for all students to bring the appropriate equipment i.e. pen, pencil and calculator to the examinations. Students must also note that no electronic device (e.g. phone, iPod, Smart Watch etc.) will be allowed into the examination venues. Such items must be left at home or handed in at the start of each examination. Please note that the College does not take responsibility for loss or damage to these items so we therefore strongly recommend that all mobile phones and electronic devices are left at home.

Public Examinations - Year 11 and Post 16 Students


The timetable of public examinations for the summer series has now been published and commences the week beginning Monday 16th May. It is of vital importance that each student attends college fully prepared for each examination he/she is entered for at least 30 minutes before it is scheduled to commence. Students are required to attend all examinations in full college uniform and with the required equipment. For Science and Mathematics examinations, they must have a calculator, ruler, pencil and a geometry set. Students must also bring a black biro to each examination. The use of mobile telephones and other electronic devices are NOT PERMITTED in the examination hall. Therefore, it is requested that students do not bring these items to college when they have an examination. If students do need to have any such devices with them, they must hand them to the invigilation staff at the start of each examination. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from the examination. Students must attend the examination(s) for which they have been entered for. In the event of illness or an emergency situation that prevents your child attending or means your child will be late, please make contact with the College as soon as possible so that appropriate advice can be given and arrangements put in place. Please note that your child's final examination grade will be adversely affected if he/she fails to attend a scheduled examination

Examinations - Supporting Your Child

As we approach the period of public examinations, it is vitally important for students to settle into regular and structured home revision to give them the best possible chance of examination success.

Below are some tips for parents, guardians and carers on how to help your child with home revision:

- Provide them with a comfortable, quiet and well-lit area to work in
- Keep siblings occupied at revision times
- Ensure they are properly hydrated and are eating well
- Ensure they have adequate sleep
- Help them to put a home revision schedule together
- Break revision times into small 15-to-20-minute periods
- Ensure they have the books and equipment they need to properly revise
- Encourage them to adopt revision techniques such as writing brief notes to act as prompts
- Keep positive, create a 'can do' attitude
